Wednesday Walk - Monga Forest Loop - 24 February 2010

Our trips to Monga Forest are mainly drives with various random stops on the loop from the western side via Granite Bluff Forest Road, Saddleback Road, Milo Road to River Forest. There are maps at both the eastern and western entrances to Monga National Park, as well as at the picnic area. There is wet sclerophyll forest as well as some rainforest. Our first stop was at the creek after we entered the National Park from the west. We found a few things flowering including *Gahnia sieberiana*, *Leptopsermum lanigerum*, *Spiranthes alticola*, *Persoonia linearis* and *Helichrysum rutidolepis*. We then drove to the top of the ridge, turning onto Saddle Back Rd. We had a little ramble, finding *Tylophora barbata* with a flower, *Acacia obtusifolia* with spent flowers, *Arrhenechthites mixta*, *Helichrysum leucopsideum*, *Pratia purpurascens* and Veronica plebeia all flowering. We then stopped to see the correas (*C. lawrenciana* var. *cordifolia*) - masses of them in bud. We then descended through fantastic tree ferns to Penance Grove, stopping to see some *Eucryphia moorei* flowering - more again at Penance Grove, where we did a quick walk of the boardwalk.
