Now for a little MOS business...

At the October Board meeting, I expressed concern for the diminishing attendance at Board meetings and the difficulty in getting hosts for the meetings. I made the suggestion that we reduce the number of Board meetings from 4 per year to 2 per year, one in July just before the beginning of the fiscal year, and one in January prior to our spring show. This proposed change will require a change in the by-laws. Board members in attendance agreed. The current by-laws, Article III, Section 2, states:

Regular Meetings. The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings quarterly, in January, April, July, and October of each year, at such times and places as shall be designated by the President, or in the absence of a designation by the President, by the Board of Trustees.

Upon approval of the membership at the regular December meeting, Article III, Section 2 shall read as follows: **Regular Meetings**. The Board of Trustees shall hold regu-lar meetings in January and July, of each year, at such times and places as shall be designated by the President, or in the absence of a designation by the President, by the Board of Trustees.


